President Tom Seng called the Board of Trustees meeting to order at 7:02pm.

There were no issues of public concern.

# Sustainability Analysis

Greg Guerrettaz discussed a draft copy of his work on the library's Sustainability Analysis.

- They calculated the historical receipts and expenses for the Hancock County Economic
  Development Income Tax (EDIT Library Portion) that is used to fund both Hancock County
  Public Library and Fortville Public Library.
- In order to maintain the current County EDIT Fund balance, future income taxes will need to increase, at a minimum, by the increase in the maximum allowable increase in the property tax levy.
- There continues to be economic uncertainty due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19).
- Based upon this information and discussions, FSG Corp. recommends that the Library continue to monitor the EDIT Fund balance and the expected future EDIT revenue.
- FSG Corp. will also be recommending no decreases from the .15% rate.
- He highlighted that the library built a new building in New Palestine in 2018 without using any additional income taxes.

Greg asked board members to contact Dave with any questions about this analysis.

The monthly statistics were reviewed. We are about back to pre-pandemic numbers for door counts and circulation.

The April 12, 2022 minutes were reviewed. Fred Fox moved to accept the minutes as presented. This was seconded by Lori Elmore. Vote was taken and the motion carried.

The April Financial Report was presented. Jeannie Roberts moved to approve the Financial Report as presented. This was seconded by Zach Schroer. Vote was taken and the motion carried.

Bills for April 1, 2022 – April 30, 2022 (\$213,885.68) were presented. Dave Gray reviewed the bills and found them all in order and recommended they be approved. Zach Schroer **moved to approve the bills as presented**. This was seconded by Libby Manship. Vote was taken and the motion carried.

- Best Sellers
- Award Winners
- o Reader Reviews Amazon, Goodreads
- o Popular author or series
- Popular across other libraries OverDrive and Baker & Taylor show what's popular in our region and other regions
- Purchase requests from patrons available through OverDrive and through our website. Get on average a couple per day
- Collection HQ's Collection Use Summary report gives a general overview of what's in-demand per section
- Collection HQ's Discovery tool useful for finding popular titles that are not in the collection
- Collection HQ is a service we use that analyzes our catalog and compares to the catalogs of other libraries.

## Selecting DVDs

- Motion Picture Association Film Ratings
  - Juvenile G or PG
  - Teen G through PG-13
  - Adult G through R
- Box office sales
- Award winners
- Popular characters & networks (like PAW Patrol and Scooby Doo, Nickelodeon, PBS, Disney, etc.)
- Patron requests
- Midwest Tape primary vendor for DVD purchases

# Selecting Video Games

- Select for PlayStation, Switch, and Xbox
  - Juvenile collection keeps older system games (PS3, Wii, Xbox 360) but are not actively selected
- Entertainment Software Rating Board (ESRB)
  - Juvenile E for Everybody
  - Teen T for Teens
  - Adult E, T, and M for Mature
- o Reviews Game Informer and user reviews

- o How well similar games have circulated at HCPL
- o Popular characters and series
- Patron requests
- AV special shelves are used for displaying DVDs and video games
- Deselection process
  - Collection HQ's "Dead Item Removal" items that haven't circulated in a certain amount of time (2 years is standard)
  - Collection HQ's "Grubby Removal" items that have a high amount of circulations and may need repaired or replaced
  - o Visually scanning for poor condition or out of date materials
  - o Duplicate copies, or items that may not be as popular as they once were
