New Business

Adult Services Department Update (Cody Flood)

Public Services Manager Cody Flood highlighted services provided and staff that represent the Adult Services Department at HCPL Main. Some of the statistics were 5,000 card renewals and 2,400 new cards issued in 2022. There have been 481,000 checkouts so far in 2023 with nearly 90,000 checkouts in June alone and over 4800 reference questions were answered over the past year. Some of the services provided by adult services staff include, but are not limited to, Book-a-Librarian, Your Next Great Read, exam proctoring, local history resources, adult programming, and material holds. The Adult services librarians also order materials for the adult collection, while the library assistants process materials being checked out and returned, as well as ensuring materials get back out on the shelf for our patrons to enjoy.

Finance Committee - Draft 2024 Budget

The Finance Committee reviewed the draft of the 2024 budget.

Bookmobile Lift Replacement

Director Dave Gray reported the bookmobile lift has failed. Due to the age of the bookmobile (2015), and high usage of the lift, an estimate for replacement was obtained from Superior Van and Mobility. Replacement parts, if obtainable, would cost approximately \$3500. To replace the lift would cost \$8926.25 and would come with a 3-year warranty. The new lift is of the same brand, BraunAbility, as the current lift. Director Dave Gray recommended to the board the lift be completely replaced. Tom Seng moved to approve replacement of the bookmobile lift at the cost of \$8926.25. This was seconded by Michelle Hasty. Vote was taken and the motion carried.

Resolution 07112023 - Authorizing Electronic and ACH Transfers

Business Manager Cindi Holloway said this resolution would allow for online payments as well as ACH transfers. Fred Fox moved to accept Resolution 07112023 allowing electronic and ACH transfers. This was seconded by Jeannie Roberts. Vote was taken and the motion carried.
